

PAMELA K. LATTIMORE

Summary of Professional Experience

Pamela K. Lattimore is Director of RTI's Center for Justice, Safety, and Resilience, which focuses on improving understanding of crime and related problems, criminal justice systems, safety threats and responses, and prevention and intervention activities designed to ameliorate societal problems and increase community and individual resilience. Her research focuses on evaluating interventions; investigating the causes and correlates of criminal behavior, including substance use and mental health; and developing approaches to improve criminal justice operations. Dr. Lattimore is principal investigator for the Evaluation of the MacArthur Foundation Safety and Justice Challenge Initiative, a new initiative focused on reducing the United States' jail populations substantially by 2020. She is an internationally recognized expert on prisoner reentry, having led the National Institute of Justice (NIJ)-funded multisite evaluation of the Serious and Violent Offender Reentry Initiative (SVORI), a multimethod, multiyear evaluation of a federal initiative to improve outcomes for offenders returning to the community from prison, and additional recidivism analyses that found long-term positive effects of reentry programming on arrest up to 56 months after release. Ongoing efforts of SVORI include conducting new interviews in two of the study sites to investigate factors associated with desistance from crime. She is leading an NIJ-funded study of reentry programs supported by Second Chance Act (SCA) grants and is the principal investigator for the NIJ-funded evaluation of the Honest Opportunity Probation with Enforcement Demonstration Field Experiment, a multisite randomized controlled trial studying the effectiveness of swift and certain sanctions to improve outcomes including drug test results, rearrest rates, revocation rates, appointment compliance, jail days served, and prison days sentenced for high-risk probationers. She is also principal investigator for a Department of Defense (DoD) multiyear, multimodal study examining military workplace violence and is a senior advisor for a cross-site evaluation of a federally funded program to benefit homeless individuals. She recently concluded a study examining human labor trafficking among migrant farm workers in North Carolina and was a co-investigator for a federally funded study identifying the prevalence of traumatic brain injury (TBI) in a state prison population, leading the analyses assessing the relationship of TBI to recidivism. She was principal investigator for the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA)-funded grant Comparison of Alternative Coercive Drug Treatment Models and for the NIJ-funded Evaluation of the Juvenile Breaking the Cycle Program. Dr. Lattimore served from 2000 until 2003 as project director/principal investigator for the National Evaluation of the Safe Schools/Healthy Students (SS/HS) Initiative, a multimethod evaluation of a federally funded program targeting school safety, mental health, substance abuse, and violence prevention in 97 sites. She was also project director for the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)-funded Coordinating Center for the Criminal Justice Diversion (CJD) Program for Individuals with Co-occurring Mental Health and Substance Abuse Disorders and principal investigator for the NIJ-funded Re-entry Court Process Evaluation. Dr. Lattimore served as a senior advisor for RTI's contract with the Drug Enforcement Administration to develop and administer the National Forensic Laboratory Information System (NFLIS). Other research has focused on evaluating the effectiveness of drug treatment programs for Florida probationers, developing methods for classifying probation populations for risk and allocating probation officers to minimize public safety risk, identifying factors associated with city-level homicide trends, and improving the cost-effectiveness of drug testing programs. Before joining RTI in 1998, Dr. Lattimore worked for 10 years at NIJ, most recently as director of the Criminal Justice and Criminal Behavior Division, Office of Research and Evaluation. She served as Chair of the Division on Corrections and Sentencing of the American Society of Criminology from 2001 to 2003, was named a Fellow of the Academy of Experimental Criminology in 2009, was awarded the

Peter P. Lejins Researcher Award from the American Correctional Association in 2015, and was named the 2015 Distinguished Scholar by the Division on Corrections and Sentencing of the American Society of Criminology in 2015. She has served on the editorial boards of several professional journals and is co-editor of a new series, *Handbook on Corrections and Sentencing*, sponsored by the American Society of Criminology's Division of Corrections and Sentencing that will be published annually beginning in 2016 by Routledge Press. Dr. Lattimore was also a professor in the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice at the University of South Carolina from 2003 to 2006.

Selected Project Experience

Evaluation of the MacArthur Foundation Safety + Justice Challenge (2014 to date)—*Principal Investigator*. The Safety + Justice Challenge (SJC) supports a network of competitively selected local jurisdictions committed to reducing over-reliance on jails in their communities. RTI is conducting a multifaceted evaluation at multiple levels of the initiative: (1) a process and outcome evaluation within intervention, learning network, and comparison sites; (2) a process evaluation of SJC partner support provided to sites; (3) process evaluations of communication and advocacy efforts by the Foundation and the partners to translate SJC accomplishments into national impacts, and (4) an impact evaluation of changes in the national jail population, disparities in that population, and public opinion around jails. Directs the creation and implementation of the evaluation design and methodology, plans and interprets analyses, prepares evaluation products, and works with staff from the Foundation and partners to accomplish evaluation objectives.

Evaluation of the FY 2011 Bureau of Justice Assistance Second Chance Act Adult Offender Reentry Demonstration Projects (2013 to date)—*Principal Investigator*. Responsible for all aspects of this NIJ-funded process, outcome, and cost-effectiveness study of eight Second Chance Act funded adult reentry programs. The study includes analysis of administrative data and survey data to examine the impact of the programs on criminal recidivism and other outcomes.

Desistance from Crime over the Life Course (2013 to date)—*Principal Investigator*. Responsible for all aspects of this NIJ-funded project that will examine the factors associated with desistance from crime among a large group of male and female offenders in two states who participated in the Multi-site Evaluation of the Serious and Violent Offender Reentry Initiative (see below) and were originally interviewed prior to release from prisons between 2004 and 2005.

Multimodal Retrospective and Prospective Unit-Level Analysis of Military Workplace Violence (2012 to date)—*Principal Investigator*. Responsible for all aspects of this research that is using complementary retrospective and prospective studies to identify static and dynamic predictors of targeted military workplace violence (MWV). The project is identifying and testing predictors of MWV, identifying and testing mediating and moderating factors for MWV, and developing recommendations for individual-, unit-, and installation-level procedures and tools to prevent or leverage dynamic and protective factors to reduce MWV. This study is funded by the Department of Defense and will include the analysis of administrative data for individuals who served in the US Army and Marine Corps between 2001 and 2012 and two waves of survey data to be collected at four large Army bases and two large Marine camps.

Evaluation of the HOPE Demonstration Field Experiment (2011 to date)—*Principal Investigator*. Responsible for all aspects of this implementation, outcome, and cost-effectiveness study of the Honest Opportunity with Enforcement (HOPE) Demonstration Field Experiment. The goal of the field experiment, being conducted in four sites, is to provide a rigorous test of the deterrent effects of swift and certain sanctions in response to positive results on random drug test and other violations on targeted outcomes, including appointment compliance, drug tests, rearrest rates, revocation rates, jail days served, and prison days sentenced. This 54-month study is funded by NIJ.

National Evaluation of SAMHSA's Homeless Programs (2011 to date)—*Senior Advisor*. Provides consultation on the analyses of GPRA and other data collected to assess the effectiveness of more than 100 SAMHSA-funded programs to benefit homeless individuals; contributes to evaluation design, design of data collection activities and instrumentation, and reporting.

Incorporating Sacred Values into Rational Choice Models (2010 to 2013)—*Co-Investigator*. Participated in an RTI-funded project to develop a theoretical model that will explain violent political behavior of individuals, including suicide bombers, as well as other criminal behavior. The model extends the rational choice model by the addition of sacred values to the individual utility function.

Identifying Indicators of Labor Trafficking of Human Beings (2010 to 2013)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. Directed the data collection and analysis and provided senior oversight of this multimethod investigation into the identification of community-level indicators of potential labor trafficking. This 3-year study was funded by NIJ and included data collection from migrant workers and stakeholders in multiple predominantly rural counties in North Carolina.

Prisoner Reentry Services: What Works for Whom (2010 to 2012)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. Directed the data collection, analysis, and reporting for this extension of the Multi-site Evaluation of the Serious and Violent Offender Reentry Initiative (see below). Additional analyses were performed on data collected under the earlier study in an effort to identify specific practices associated with positive prisoner reentry. In addition, administrative rearrest and reincarceration data were supplemented to provide an average of 5 years of recidivism follow-up; death records were collected to examine mortality.

Evaluation of DHHS Substance Abuse Survey Data Collection Efforts (2009 to 2011)—*Task Leader*. For this task contracted by SAMHSA, conducted a comprehensive needs assessment and evaluation of alcohol and drug surveys and data collection systems at DHHS.

National Cross-Site Evaluation of Grants to Benefit Homeless Individuals (GBHI) (2009 to 2011)—*Analysis Task Leader*. As data analysis task leader, contributed to designing the evaluation, instrumentation, and analysis plans and was integrally involved in data analysis, interpretation, and reporting.

Statewide Investigation of Traumatic Brain Injury in Prisons (2007 to 2012)—*Co-Investigator*. Directed the data collection and provided senior oversight of recidivism studies for this Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)-funded investigation into the prevalence and impact of traumatic brain injury (TBI) in adults imprisoned in South Carolina. This 4-year study, for which RTI was a subcontractor to the Medical University of South Carolina, involved interviews with a stratified sample of more than 600 South Carolina prisoners. Interview data was matched with administrative data from South Carolina's Data Warehouse, which includes emergency room, hospital, social services, arrest, and correctional system data from state agencies. The aims of the study were (1) to provide interval estimates of prevalence rates of TBI, substance abuse, and violence among representative samples of male and female prisoners; (2) to test the hypothesis that recidivism will be significantly greater in the TBI group than in the NTBI group; and (3) to investigate the feasibility of conducting routine screening for a history of TBI in the prison setting.

Multi-site Evaluation of the Serious and Violent Offender Reentry Initiative (SVORI) (2003 to 2009)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. Directed and managed a multidisciplinary team that conducted implementation assessment, impact and cost-benefit evaluations for this Department of Justice (DOJ)/Department of Labor (DOL)/Health and Human Services (HHS)/Housing and Urban Development (HUD)-funded initiative to improve postrelease outcomes for offenders returning to their communities following incarceration. The NIJ-funded study included initial assessment of the 69 SVORI grantees that identified and characterized a total of 89 SVORI programs. Following an in-depth review and site visits, 12 adult and 4 juvenile programs were selected for inclusion in the impact evaluation that included the collection of four waves of interviews with program participants and comparison subjects, as well as administrative rearrest and reincarceration data. More than 7,000 prerelease and follow-up interviews were completed with adults and juveniles participating in the evaluation.

Re-entry Court Process Evaluation (2001 to 2003)—*Principal Investigator*. Oversaw the NIJ-funded process evaluation of the Prisoner Re-entry Courts Initiative, which examined the progress in implementation of re-entry programs in nine pilot sites.

Comparison of Alternative Coercive Drug Treatment Models (1999 to 2005)—*Principal Investigator*. Directed and managed the activities of this 5-year NIDA-funded grant. The study's three-way design compared the effectiveness of drug courts versus traditional courts, drug offender versus regular probation, and treatment versus no treatment in reducing recidivism and drug use among probationers in Florida judicial circuits. The study included a process component, extensive analysis of administrative data, and the collection and analysis of probationer interview data.

Evaluation of the Juvenile Breaking the Cycle Program (1999 to 2005)—*Principal Investigator*. Directed and managed the process and outcome evaluations of this national model program to identify and treat substance abuse problems in juvenile offenders. The outcome evaluation included the collection of baseline and two rounds of follow-up survey data from more than 300 youth processed by the Division of Youth Services in Lane County, OR.

National Evaluation of the Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative (1999 to 2003)—*Project Director*. Directed and managed a multidisciplinary team that is conducting process, outcome, and economic evaluations for this 5-year, DOJ/DoED/HHS-funded initiative to reduce substance abuse and violence and improve mental health in children in more than 97 communities nationwide. The multi-method approach included the collection and analysis of multiple waves of survey data from multiple respondents (14 surveys), the collection and analysis of archival data, and, in selected sites, cost and case studies.

Criminal Justice Diversion Interventions for Individuals with Co-Occurring Mental Illness and Substance Abuse Disorders (1998 to 2002)—*Project Manager and Co-Principal Investigator*. Directed cross-site activities and analyses for this SAMHSA-funded, nine-site evaluation of criminal justice system diversion for individuals with co-occurring mental health and substance abuse problems. Directed all activities associated with the process and outcome evaluation of integrated mental health and substance abuse service delivery within the sites, including instrument development for local site data collection, data collection training and quality control, data processing and management, cross-site statistical analyses, reporting on status and findings, and technical assistance for local site evaluation activities.

National Forensic Laboratory Information System (NFLIS)—*Task Leader for Analysis and Reporting* (1998 to 2001); *Senior Advisor* (2001 to 2003). Advised on the development of data analysis and information-reporting approaches for this DEA-funded project to develop and administer the NFLIS—a database that includes results of drug evidence analyses conducted by more than 170 state and local forensic laboratories. Advised on the design of the analysis plan and development of collateral multi-site projects to enhance the value of information derived from this new national source of drug information.

Impact of Florida's Substance Abuse Treatment Programs for Probationers (1996 to 1999)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. This project, conducted in collaboration with the Florida Department of Correction, showed that residential and nonresidential substance abuse treatment programs for Florida probationers have been effective in reducing the 2-year failure rates of those under supervision.

Integrated Resource Allocation Model for Probation and Parole (1996 to 1999)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. This project developed a workload balancing model for the Florida Department of Correction that uses risk classification outputs as inputs for a model that allocates officer time over caseloads according to the riskiness of the caseloads. The model optimally allocates available officer time to achieve maximum public safety as measured by rearrest and technical violations. A decision support system that allows probation management to evaluate various classification and supervision strategies was also developed.

Homicide in U.S. Cities Project (1995 to 1998)—*Project Director*. The purpose of this multiphase NIJ project was to examine homicide in U.S. cities from a variety of perspectives. Structured interviews were conducted by the project team with more than two dozen stakeholders in eight cities; these qualitative data were combined with archival data for a quantitative and qualitative examination of the correlates of homicide in eight cities (1995 to 1997); an investigation of the relationship between incapacitation and violent crime (1998); and a spatial and temporal analysis of homicide in selected U.S. cities (1997 to 1998).

Automated, MIS-Based Risk Classification for Probationers (1994 to 1997)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. This project developed a model-based risk classification system for probationers using inputs from an automated administrative database. The model parameters were integrated into the Department of Corrections information system to allow automatic generation and updating of risk classifications for all probationers. Worked closely with the department to implement this system statewide.

Death Rates of Serious Young Offenders (1994 to 1996)—*Principal Investigator*. This study examined the death rates and causes of death of parolees from the California Youth Authority.

Race and Recidivism (1993 to 1998)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. This study used a variety of statistical approaches to examine the relationship between race and recidivism.

Application of Quality Control Techniques to Improve Drug Testing Programs (1992 to 1998)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. This project showed that acceptance sampling, a quality control method, can be used to reduce the number of drug tests required to achieve reduced drug use in a probation population. The acceptance sampling model was developed, a multi-site field experiment was conducted in conjunction with the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority, and another application was tested using data from the Los Angeles county transit authority.

Modeling the Behavior of Serious Youthful Offenders (1988 to 1998)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. This long-term study examined the ability of various types of statistical models to enhance our understanding of the correlates of offending and the ability to predict re-offending. A variety of studies were conducted, including *Negative Binomial Models of the Frequency of Offending* (1996 to 1998); *Predicting Rearrest for Violence* (1992 to 1995); *Markov Analysis of Offending Patterns* (1992 to 1994); and *Predicting Recidivism of Serious Youthful Offenders Using Survival Models* (1988 to 1991).

Forecasting Demand for Prisons (1987 to 1997)—*Co-Principal Investigator*. This project developed a prison population projection model for NC prisons.

Evaluation of an Interagency Vocational Training Program for Youthful Offenders (1983 to 1988)—*Project Manager*. NIJ grant 85-IJ-CX-0060. This 5-year controlled experiment examined the

effectiveness of vocational training combined with a variety of other services on the post-release behavior of 600 youthful property offenders.
